

Copyright Policy (DMCA Notice & Takedown)

Marquee Broadcasting West respects the intellectual property rights of others and expects users of our websites, digital platforms, and services to do the same.

If you are a copyright owner, or authorized to act on behalf of one, and you believe that content available through our services infringes your copyrighted work, you may submit a notification under the Digital Millennium Copyright Act (“DMCA”) pursuant to 17 U.S.C. §512(c)(3).

Submitting a DMCA Takedown Notice

To file a notice of claimed infringement, please provide the following information in writing:

1. Identification of the copyrighted work claimed to have been infringed, or, if multiple works are covered by a single notice, a representative list of those works.
2. Identification of the allegedly infringing material, including sufficient information to allow us to locate the material (such as the specific URL or link).
3. Your contact information, including your name, mailing address, telephone number, and email address.
4. A statement that you have a good faith belief that the use of the material in the manner complained of is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law.
5. A statement that the information in the notice is accurate, and under penalty of perjury, that you are the copyright owner or authorized to act on behalf of the owner.
6. Your physical or electronic signature.

Counter-Notification Procedure

If you believe that content you posted was removed or disabled by mistake or misidentification, you may submit a counter-notification under the DMCA.

A counter-notice must include the following:

1. Identification of the material that was removed or disabled and the location where it appeared before removal.
2. A statement under penalty of perjury that you have a good faith belief the material was removed or disabled as a result of mistake or misidentification.
3. Your name, address, telephone number, and email address.
4. A statement that you consent to the jurisdiction of the Federal District Court for the district in which you reside (or, if outside the United States, the District of Oregon), and that you will accept service of process from the person who submitted the original infringement notice.
5. Your physical or electronic signature.

Restoration of Content

If we receive a valid counter-notification, we may forward it to the original complaining party. Unless the copyright owner files an action seeking a court order against the content provider, we may restore the removed material within 10–14 business days, at our sole discretion, as permitted under the DMCA.
